



## The Vazquez Family Scenario

There was a family of five who lived in Oxnard, California. They worked in the orange orchards every year from February - August or September. This year Mr. Vasquez is told that he will not be needed next season because he is unable to climb up and down the latter fast enough.

Mr. Vazquez finds out from another worker that there is work in Manzanola, Colorado, working in the onion fields. Mr. Vazquez and his son pack up their truck and head out to Colorado.

They arrive at the local gas station in Manzanola to ask for directions. They find out that the cashier rents apartments to temporary migrant workers. They are able to secure housing the first day of arrival. They get settled and head out to apply for work in the onion fields. They are hired on the spot and begin work on September 3, 2013. Mrs. Vazquez heads to Manzanola and arrives on September 7, 2013 and also starts working in the onion fields.

After two weeks from Mrs. Vazquez arriving in Manzanola she is able to send her brother gas money to bring the children to Manzanola.

The children are:

Juana Jocelyn, her birthday is 8/11/2004 and she was born in Grand Junction, CO.

Uriel Jr., his birthday is 11/03/2007 and he was born in Grand Junction, CO.

Jonathan Vasquez and his birthday is 7/21/1997 and he was born in Chula Vista, CA.

Marvin Uriel, is Mrs. Vazquez's brother and he is 20 years old and his birthday is 7/19/1994 and he was born in Salinas, CA.

<b>Age:</b> The child(ren) is(are) younger than 22.		
<b>School Completion:</b> The child is eligible for a free public education through grade 12 under state law.		
<b>Move:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The child moved on his or her own as a migratory agricultural worker/migratory fisher OR the child moved with or to join/precede a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migratory agricultural worker/migratory fisher, <b>AND</b></li> <li>• The move was from one school district to another, <b>AND</b></li> <li>• The move was due to economic necessity, <b>AND</b></li> <li>• The move occurred within the past 36 months</li> </ul>		
<b>Purpose of the Move:</b> One purpose of the worker’s move was to seek or obtain qualifying work: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The worker moved to obtain qualifying work and obtained it, <b>OR</b></li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The worker moved to obtain any work and obtained qualifying work soon after the move, <b>OR</b></li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The worker moved for qualifying work specifically, but did not obtain the work, <b>AND</b></li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The worker has a prior history of moves to obtain qualifying work <b>OR</b></li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is other credible evidence that the worker actively sought qualifying work soon after the move</li> </ul>		
<b>Qualifying Work:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The employment is seasonal or temporary <b>AND</b></li> <li>• The work is agricultural or fishing.</li> </ul>
